MVE-Class Objective

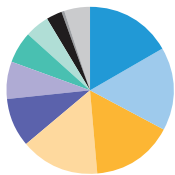

Monthly Fact Sheet

MVE-Class Review

- In March, the MVE – Class outperformed its benchmark, the S&P/ASX 300 Index, which was down –0.24% in Australian-dollar terms.

Contributors

- For March, holdings within healthcare and an underweight to financials contributed, while our underweight to the materials sector and holdings within utilities detracted.
- Diagnostic company Sonic Healthcare contributed during the month as its February half-year result revealed better-than-expected operating performance, allaying investor concerns around the impact of cost inflation and the roll-off of high-margin COVID testing on profitability. On an operating level, Sonic materially outperformed listed peers in key markets, demonstrating above industry base business growth and excellent cost control.
- Lack of exposure to Macquarie contributed, as the market digested the company’s conservative outlook statement.
- Pallet pooling company Brambles outperformed in March following a strong half-year result at the end of February. Its defensive nature became increasingly attractive as uncertainty rose in markets regarding the instability in the financial system.

Detractors

- An underweight to mining company BHP detracted from results as the price of iron ore rallied at the end of the month, and BHP outperformed in line with this.
- Gas pipeline company APA Group underperformed following a government decision to build an electricity interconnector in a remote part of Queensland. While this is a long-dated project, it will render a small portion of APA’s assets less competitive. We do not see this as material to the company’s valuation, and the connection also creates upside options for APA.
- Insurance broker AUB detracted after reporting a strong half-year result in February. There was little news driving the result, and peer Steadfast held its ground in the month. We do not see the stock’s move as significant.

MVE-Class Change Highlights

- During the month, we bought shares of health insurer Medibank. Following the company’s cyber incident late last year, we wanted to see evidence that customer numbers would not be materially adversely affected. Medibank’s February result gave us the confidence to buy back in.
- We added shares in lottery operator The Lottery Corporation, attracted by its strong cash flows and balance sheet combined with a resilient business model.
- We sold shares of Japan-based telecommunications company NTT and trimmed our position in Westpac, as we saw better opportunities elsewhere.
