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Fund Highlights

The Fund returned 3.12% (after fees), outperforming the benchmark which returned 2.43%.

The major contributors to the strategy's return were Electric Utilities, Energy Infrastructure and Water. The detractors from the strategy's return were the Seaports, Electricity Transmission and Airports. Relative to the S&P Global Infrastructure Index and in local currency terms, major stock contributors to the Fund's return included SSE, Vinci, and Cellnex Telecom. Getlink, West Japan Railway and East Japan Railway were among the significant detractors. Relative to the S&P Global Infrastructure Index, the major positive contributors were positions in the Airports, Toll Roads and Water sectors. Positions in the Seaports, Electricity Transmission and Airports detracted.

Key Contributors to Outperformance

1. **SSE**, an operator of electric networks and renewable power generation, rose as the market recognised the company's attractive collection of assets and its attractive valuation.
2. **Vinci**, an operator of toll road and airport concessions around the world, rose amidst continued improvements in mobility post the COVID disruptions.
3. **Cellnex**, an operator of European cell phone towers, rose as the market appreciated the company's discipline in walking away from a potentially expensive and dilutive transaction for a competitor's assets.

Key Detractors to Outperformance

1. **Getlink**, the operator of the Channel Tunnel, rose as the market recognised the extraordinary profits that its Elec link asset (a transmission cable that runs through the tunnel) would generate given the power volatility in Europe.
2. **West Japan Rail**, an operator of Japanese rail assets, fell slightly as the market continues to focus on short-term momentum amidst the slow recovery of post-COVID mobility in Japan.
3. **East Japan Rail**, an operator of Japanese rail assets, rose slightly but lagged the benchmark as the market continues to focus on short-term momentum amidst the slow recovery of post-COVID mobility in Japan.
