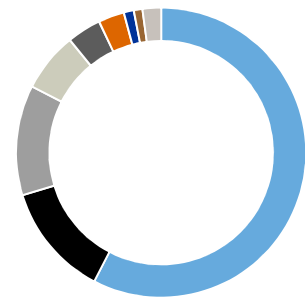

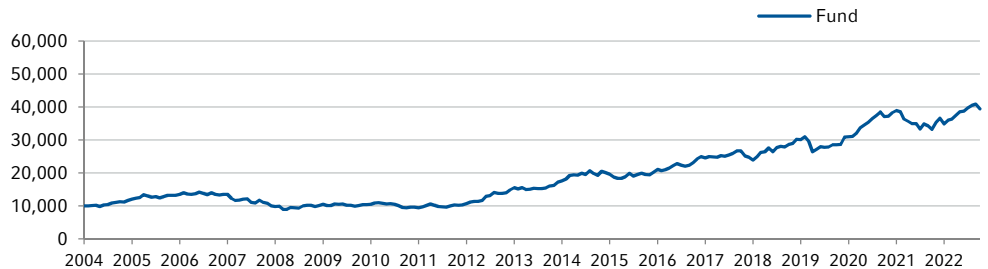

Fund commentary

The Russell Investments Global Opportunities Fund performed in line with the benchmark in the September quarter. However, the Fund did deliver negative absolute returns over the period.

An overweight exposure and strong stock selection in Japan contributed positively to performance, including our holdings in retailer Ryohin Keikaku Co., Toyo Tire Corp. and car maker Suzuki Motor Corp. All three stocks posted strong, double-digit gains for the quarter. Stock selection in the UK also added value over the period; notably overweights to electric services company Centrica and multinational aerospace and defence firm Rolls-Royce. A short position in insurer Prudential added further value after the stock fell more than 20% over the period. Other notable positions to add value were overweights to Canadian integrated energy company Suncor Energy and an ex-benchmark holding in Taiwanese semiconductor manufacturing company Alchip Technologies. In contrast, poor stock selection in the US detracted from overall performance, including underweights to chipmaker NVIDIA Corp., oil major Exxon Mobil and pharmaceutical company Eli Lilly & Co. Other US positions to impact returns were overweights to HCA Healthcare, Microsoft and medical device maker Insulet Corp. Stock selection in emerging markets also weighed on performance. This included our holdings in Chinese mining company Ganfeng Lithium Co. and South Korea's Samsung Electronics. Performance was further impacted by stock selection in Continental Europe; notably overweights to French luxury goods maker LVMH Moët Hennessy Louis Vuitton SE, Swiss peer Cie Financiere Richemont SA and German car makers Mercedes-Benz AG and BMW.

The ESG Risk Score is the weighted average of the Sustainalytics' Risk Score for companies in the portfolio. The Sustainalytics' Risk Score focuses on ESG issues that are financially material to the company and incorporates both risk exposure and issue management. The scores range from 0 to 100 where higher scores imply higher ESG risk. The Carbon Footprint is the Weighted Average Carbon Intensity which we define as relative carbon emissions as the weighted average of portfolio companies' Scope 1 & 2 GHG emissions divided by revenue (CO₂e/\$1M revenue USD). Tobacco exposure is defined as the weight of securities in the portfolio classified as being in the GICS tobacco subindustry.

Man Numeric Investors	Core global equities, global low volatility	10.0	Numeric Investors outperformed the benchmark over the quarter, benefiting from overweights to leading Danish pharmaceutical company Novo Nordisk A/S and UK electric services company Centrica.
Nissay Asset Management	Japanese equities	10.0	Japan equity specialist Nissay Asset Management outperformed the benchmark over the quarter, driven by overweights to retailer Ryohin Keikaku Co., Suzuki Motor Corp. and Toyo Tire Corp.
Oaktree Capital	Emerging markets	11.0	Emerging markets specialist Oaktree Capital underperformed the benchmark over the quarter, driven in part by overweights to Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Co. and Brazilian department store Lojas Renner S.A.

Sanders Capital	Core global value	16.0	Sanders underperformed the benchmark over the quarter, driven in part by overweights to HCA Healthcare (US) and German car makers BMW and Mercedes-Benz AG.
Wellington Management Company	Global growth equity	8.0	Wellington underperformed the benchmark over the quarter, driven in part by overweights to US names Insulet Corp., Block and casino and resort company Las Vegas Sands.
