Fund description

The Fund is an actively managed fund investing in a portfolio of 15 – 25 mainly Australian property and property related equity securities across a range of geographic and economic sectors.

Target market

The Target Market Determination (TMD) for the Fund sets out the class of consumers for whom the product, including its key attributes, would likely be consistent with their likely objectives, financial situation and needs. To access to the TMD and other Fund documentation visit our website.

Investment strategy

The Fund uses a multi-step investment process for constructing the Fund's investment portfolio that combines top-down sector allocation with bottom-up individual stock selection.

Top-down sector allocation is determined through a systematic evaluation of listed and direct property market trends and conditions.

Bottom-up stock selection is driven by proprietary analytical techniques to conduct fundamental company analysis, which provides a framework for security selection through an analysis of individual securities independently and relative to each other.

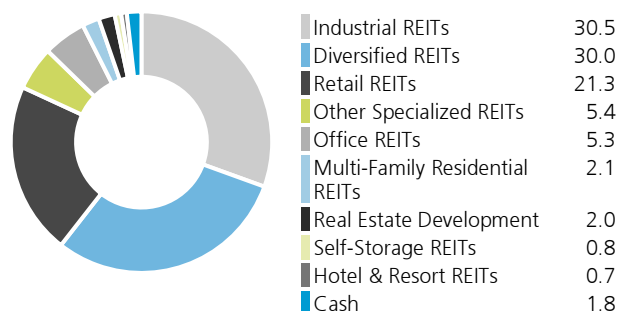
Investment objective

Fund performance

The Fund returned +0.69% during June, outperforming the S&P/ASX 300 AREIT Index by 0.78%.

The top monthly contributor to performance was the Fund's overweight position in HMC Capital Limited. The fund manager announced a \$400m equity commitment within its Last Mile Logistics Fund, marking the Group's first significant institutional equity contribution. The Group also announced its Unlisted Healthcare & Life Sciences Fund is on track for its first close in September.

The Fund's underweight position in Region Group also contributed to monthly performance. The convenience and discretionary retail asset owner underperformed in response to falling consumer confidence in a rising interest rate environment.

The main detractor from monthly performance was the Fund's overweight position in National Storage REIT. The storage asset owner underperformed after providing a market update that disclosed a fall in occupancy, impacted by a weaker consumer environment. The Fund's overweight position in Ingenia Communities Group also detracted from monthly performance after flagging increased buyer caution is impacting residential activity levels and sales rates.

Market review

The Australian REIT market (S&P/ASX 300 A-REIT Index) decreased by -0.1% in June, underperforming the broader S&P/ASX 300, which returned +1.7%.

During June, AREIT balance sheets were in focus, following the RBA lifting the cash rate 25 basis points to 4.10%. A-REITs with higher gearing and/or low fixed interest rate protection were the most impacted, whilst groups with higher growth and conservative balance sheets outperformed.

Ahead of reporting season, numerous AREITs released preliminary June 2023 portfolio revaluations. Higher duration, long WALE portfolios saw the largest value declines up to 8%. Similarly, office values declined between 4% and 8% due to challenging operating fundamentals and weaker income growth. Convenience retail, industrial, and childcare sectors saw modest value declines with capitalisation rate expansion largely offset by income growth. Healthcare sector values performed well on average, skewed upwards by the recognition of a \$90m gain on acquired development projects by HealthCo Healthcare and Wellness REIT.

Market outlook

A continuing theme facing markets is rising interest rates and inflation. Real estate securities provide a strong hedge in an inflationary environment given many lease structures typically benefit from either fixed or inflation linked reviews. Our proprietary analysis suggests over the past twenty years, Australian REITs have outperformed broader Australian equities during periods of above-average inflation.

A-REITs are well-positioned with defensive valuations and growth outlook. The Fund is maintaining a relatively balanced exposure to value and growth-orientated names. Positioning is towards companies with balance sheet capacity, quality assets and aligned management teams, whilst also selectively exposed to several deeper value real estate securities which are expected to benefit from the economic recovery. The Fund is strategically positioned to take advantage of attractive long-dated structural themes such as industrial, residential, agriculture, and childcare.

Compelling valuation support has emerged with the sector trading at a 14% discount to net asset value. Balance sheets are healthy with moderate gearing levels. As market volatility persists, we anticipate the Australian REIT sector's resilient cash flows will be highly sought after.
